Areas of Learning

- Classical children's tales, season tales
- Introducing oneself, objects in class, basic instructions, asking basic questions and giving simple answers, animals and party food, colours, clothes, basic verbs and parts of the body with emphasis on reading and writing
- Combination of letters, auxiliary verbs, personal pronouns, distinction of singular and plural, definitive articles
- Ancient Greek Mythology (Heroes, Giants and Titans)

Approaches to learning

- Vocabulary reading and memorisation with the aid of songs and rhymes
- Discussion of language learning and sharing of ideas and experiences
- Use context and previous knowledge to determine meaning and pronunciation
- Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing
- Apply knowledge about letters and simple grammatical knowledge to experiment with writing
- Role playing

Examples of learning

Pupils reproduce language in various opportunities.

Role plays and various games that require turn taking and active participation are deployed for this purpose.

Experimentation with writing starts at this point with writing known words and sentences after oral practice on each topic.
