

Year 3 Art

Areas of Learning

- Painting (colour, space, paint, watercolours)
- Drawing (line, shape, pencil, charcoal), technique and pencil control
- Artwork with different materials: pattern, texture, form
- Artists and designers in history
- Portraits and landscapes
- Arts and crafts: 3D pieces of art

Approaches to learning

- Children develop their drawing skills charcoal, pencils and sketching. They incorporate previously learned techniques i.e. line, shape (geometric and irregular), colour and space.
- Pupils plan, create and evaluate a painting using watercolours. They refine skills in painting and drawing and develop and share ideas. They use paints to recap on the techniques previously learned. Pupils review and evaluate their work.
- Children look at the life and work of artists and do work inspired by these artist e.g. Monet, Van Gogh, etc Pupils compare ideas in their work and the work of others and say what they feel about them.
- Pupils use a range of materials creatively to design and make products. They create and use a wide range of patterns and colours.

Examples of learning

Pupils use a wide variety of art materials (paint, watercolour, pencils, charcoal and art and crafts materials). ICT resources are used so that pupils can look at the work of famous artists and enhance their learning/watch online drawing techniques. Group work and peer learning are used to provide a wealth of different learning techniques.
