Areas of Learning

- Stories and tales, advertisements, childrens' favourite games, parties, food recipes, bread in time, recycling, robots and other machines (Greek as a Second Language)
- Ordering in restaurants, descriptions of animals, saying the time, sports, the 12 Gods of Olympus, months and anniversaries (Greek as a Foreign Language)
- Writing letters and diaries, story-telling
- Auxiliary verbs, present and past tense of active voice verbs, the use of nouns and adjectives in sentences, punctuation
- Ancient Greek History (Prehistory, Cycladic, Minoan, Mycenaean Civilizations)

Approaches to learning

- Developing listening skills using audiovisual resources and speaking skills through presenting ideas, information and experiences orally to a range of audience
- Apply knowledge of spelling patterns and grammatical rules to improve writing skills.
- Using context to determine meaning of new words
- Use of dictionaries to look up new words and spellings
- Group activities

Examples of learning

Pupils are provided with familiar texts that are enjoyable and can be committed to memory and used as models for writing. Pupils produce their own text using the material provided. Pupils' writing develops through application of knowledge. Storytelling and descriptions of people and situations are the focus of this year.
