Areas of Learning

- Descriptive, narrative texts, comic texts and theatrical plays, presenting arguments orally, story-telling and story-writing
- The water and the sea, road safety, childrens' right, writing systems in antiquity, (Greek as a Second Language)
- Greetings, casual communication, portraits, in class, where we live, geography (facts), professions and studies, my personal profile (Greek as a Foreign Language)
- Nouns, adjectives, pronouns, tenses of active voice verbs, numerical adjectives, adverbs
- Ancient Greek History (Ancient Athens and Sparta, Classical Art, Ancient Greek Theaters)

Approaches to learning

- Identify different text types and deal with authentic texts
- Look and listen for audiovisual clues to improve understanding of unfamiliar texts
- Application of a range of linguistic knowledge to create written production
- Develop the ability to understand new words
- Use of dictionary
- Practising new language orally
- Peer evaluation
- Group activities

Examples of learning

Pupils' knowledge and use of language is extended through exposure to texts addressed to different audiences. Pupils aim to produce differentiated written texts through working in pairs, making use of printed and electronic resources.
