




THE KITE RIDER




THE GOLDFISH BOY







ARMIN GREDER






NORTHERN LIGHTS




PRIVATE PEACEFUL

Former Children's Laureate Michael Morpurgo uses all his superb storytelling skills to weave this powerful, poignant tale of the horrors of World War I, which will touch readers of all ages.




THE EAGLE


THE SECRET GARDEN
